

Yukiko is a dancer, choreographer and co-founder of SAY. She has been working internationally with contemporary dance companies such as Agudo Dance, Art of Spectra(SE), Cathy Waller, James Cousins, Norrdans (SE), Rhiannon Faith, TRIBE and more. Commercial credit includes Nike, Marvel, Cold Play and Ministry of Sound.


Choreography credits include National Dance Company of Wales (SAY), Norrdans, The Place, Northern School of Contemporary Dance, London Studio Centre and Ballet Boyz (R&D). Musical and Theatre credits include 'A Little Night Music' (Story House), 'Miss Julie' (Southwark Playhouse) as well as her own work. She has received a Choreography Award from DanceXchange and was mentored by Akram Khan Company supported by Sky Arts. She is currently an associate artist at The Place and Dance East associates as SAY.



Renaud Wiser

Renaud is a Swiss born dance artist with an international career spanning over 20 years. Renaud is the Artistic Director of Renaud Wiser Dance Company, a London based company created in 2013 and, since 2018, he directs Newcastle-based company Fertile Ground. He is a founder-member of New Movement Collective and Body Intelligence Collective, a multi-disciplinary group winner of the first London Dansathon.

As a choreographer, his work (individual and collaborative) has been presented in key venues in the UK including Sadler's Wells Lilian Baylis, the Southbank Centre, Dance City, DanceEast, Greenwich Dance, Pavilion Dance South West and Rich Mix as well as in festivals in France, Belgium, Poland, Latvia, Italy and Switzerland.



Carrie Whitaker

Carrie co-founded Lîla Dance with Abi Mortimer in 2005. She developed the choreographic voice of Lîla and was the central dancer for the company for over 12 years, performing in all company repertoire touring nationally and internationally. Currently her roles in the company include choreographer, director and performer as well as delivering commissions and participatory work. Carrie directed Lîla's current touring production The Hotel Experience for theatrical and non-theatrical settings including community casts and has co-directing Lîla's Outdoor work.

As a freelance performer Carrie has worked with Clod Ensemble, Haptic Dance, Flexer & Sandiland, Marisa Zanotti, Charlie Morrisey and Gravity and Levity. She is committed to the development of young talent, and for the past 15 years has delivered on national community dance projects including the CAT programmes and satellite schemes in partnership with The Point, Trinity Laban and The Place. She has been commissioned to create work on professionals, postgraduate/undergraduate students, elder companies and non-dancers across the UK. Carrie's work is rooted in narrative, often funny, sometimes moving, made with the audience at its heart.




Sarah Golding | STATE

Sarah trained at Trinity Laban and received a BA and MA in dance performance. She became a dancer with Lîla Dance in 2014 where she toured nationally and rurally. She has performed for theatre companies and choreographers including the Royal Court, Bang Bang Bang group, Darcy Wallace, Quang Kien Van, Cathy Waller, Adam Russell. Sarah has most recently performed with the world touring cast of STOMP. Sarah's choreographic credits include Balletboyz (the intro.), Royal Court, Laban and Mountview. She was also movement director on the West End play Cruise. Sarah has recently begun her creative partnership with Yukiko Masui (SAY) and they are currently associate artists at The Place and Dance East.

Sarah Golding's new work STATE is rooted in the relationship between music and dance, exploring different ways to translate music into and out of the body.

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Technical Information

- The company tours with its own lighting and sound technician
- Minimum clear performance space required 8m x 8m
- Get-in on the same day of the performance; 16 people on the road including technician and director
- Further technical information can be provided on request
- Duration: The performance is approximately 1 hour or 1.20, plus interval



Creative Learning and Participation

mapdance offers a tailor-made educational programme delivering oneoff workshops, half day and full day workshops or longer-term residencies based on the company's repertoire.

Workshops give participants an insight into the creative choreographic process and full day workshops and longer-term residencies can involve dedicated projects or short 'curtain raisers' with participants to complement the touring programme.

The learning outcomes from working with the company are:

- Development of technical, choreographic and creative skills
- · Enhanced understanding of dance making
- · Improved problem-solving skills
- Strengthened social skills and confidence in sharing and communication
- · Development of leadership skills
- Awareness of physicality and health impacts of participation in dance

All workshops and residencies are led by the members of the company, enabling participants to also gain an insight into the dancers training and experience.

The education programme is suitable for Key Stages 3 & 4, Further Education and Community dance groups

The company can also offer a dedicated programme for Key Stage 1 & 2

Half-Day Workshop: 2 - 2.5 hour session (2-3 dancers)

A warm up followed by a creative workshop using ideas from one of the pieces of repertory. Students will have the opportunity to gain greater insight into the work of one of the choreographers whilst developing technical, expressive and performance skills.

Full Day Workshop: 2 x 2 - 2.5 hour sessions (3-4 dancers)

Option 1: The dancers work with one group of participants for the whole day. In the morning they will work on an extended technique class. This will be in a contemporary dance style or could be an exploratory contact improvisation session. The afternoon will be devoted to exploring one piece of the repertory which can lead to the creation of a curtain raiser. Option 2: The dancers work with two groups of participants. Each group will either undertake a technique/Improvisation/contact class followed by a creative exploration or phrase of material from the repertory.

3 Day Residency/Curtain Raiser (3-4 dancers)

The longer residency experience enables participants to develop further creative and choreographic skills.

This might culminate in a whole school performance or opening a mapdance performance.

Extended Workshops over a period:

1x2 hour session minimum (2-3 dancers)

Workshops run regularly over several weeks allow time to build relationships with the students and deepen their learning experience. These can only be delivered within one hour's travel time from Chichester.

Pre and post show talks are available.

All our fees are fully negotiable. As a guide our performance fee is normally £800. Please call to discuss your requirements. Group ticket deals for workshops and performances available in negotiation with the local venue and tour booker.
